

Our June meeting is our annual Works in Progress Critique

Every year we hold a "Works in Progress" critique and we are fortunate to have professional artist, Pete Van Riper, to facilitate our critique this year. This is **not a judging of a final piece of artwork**. This critique is meant to assist each artist in completing their artwork through helpful constructive comments. Many times while we are creating our "master pieces" we get stuck and are unsure how to complete it.

We work and rework our artwork but still can't get it the way we want. Critiques from fellow artists can be very helpful and offer a huge insight and learning tool. This year we are lucky to have professional artist, Pete Van Riper, to critique our unfinished artwork and help us get "unstuck". Any SAG member who would like to participate can bring in one piece of unfinished artwork to be professionally critiqued.

Pete Van Riper

As an artist and a person, Pete Van Riper is very enamored with the human form. His approach is to express humanity in the figure by rendering the subtle anatomical details so as to create a speaking likeness, not only of just the portrait, but also of the whole figure. Whether a significant part of the composition or a minor element of the figure, he believes the finest of lines, shades of value, or a subtle variation in the contour can alter the personality of the subject. He feels an empathic connection to the figures he draws, and am very careful to manipulate the form to create an engaging personality and to portray the figure with great respect.

As a teacher, his focus is to encourage the students to creatively apply the fundamentals of art. his classes, principally beginning drawing, center on mixed media applications as a means to explore individualized expressions of gesture, contour, and value adding lines.

His own style reflects a fascination with the effect of a seamless flow of value over the figure, created by a weave of lines that rely on optical mixing to create the value tones. The appeal of the approach is the dual nature; it's as technically precise as it is a meditative free-flowing creative expression of form. The style emerged as a result of studying classical and contemporary masters. As familiarity of the master techniques increased, an intuitive style began to emerge. The resulting effect was the portrayal of the figure without influence from outside factors such as existing styles, or schools of thought, but rather a pure reflection of what he finds appealing in art.

His growth as an artist is the result of both a desire to expand his visual vocabulary in order to portray the figure with a more spontaneous, creative flair, and his natural curiosity of how the various mixed media approaches I teach in class will apply to his outlook.

as well as saving whole magazine issues to an art bookshelf. Now there's a new way for reading those magazines - the ones you used to read plus many, many more! They are now available to read for free, but the only catch is, you must read them on a tablet or computer.


The app to do that is **Libby**, which is a great app for listening to audiobooks, and reading ebooks & e-magazines. All you need to take advantage of these great features is a Fairfax County (or other) library card.



When you download and install the app, then sign up

and sign in, the

library home page shows magazines as one of the available options. Then subject categories are offered, of which art is one. Within the art category, some 261 magazines are available. Not all are painting magazines, as the term "art" is pretty broad, but there are enough to soak up all your spare time! I subscribe to the (nonart) New Yorker (to read the cartoons), but also to several art magazines.
