Bryan Jernigan Adventure with Pastel Painting

I've been drawn to soft pastel for more than 15 years. It is one of the most versatile painting mediums, offering many layering options, traveling easily for plein air work and allowing artists to capture the spirit of a place through gesture, line and composition. Growing up in southwest Oklahoma, I was treated daily to amazing skies, ever-changing weather and flower colors that bordered on the unbelievable.





The two together – pastel and landscapes – were a natural fit for my work as an artist. Using my knowledge of composition, value and color, I have been able to hone my landscape skills to create pieces that exude a feeling of déjà vu, a recognition or realization that even if viewers haven't visited the scene I've created, they can being there.

I've also been fortunate to be able to travel the world – both for work and for artistic pleasure. While I love painting outdoors, it's often not practical, so I always take photos from wherever I may be traveling and then interpret scenes from them when I'm back in my studio. I also have a love of abstraction and teach it using acrylics in several venues in Northern Virginia, including a regular schedule at the Art League of Alexandria, ArtHouse7, Falls Church Arts and the Vienna Art Society.

I occasionally take students on artistic trips overseas, including places as diverse as France, Scotland and Mexico. There's always something new to see and react to in an artistic way. Jernigan is an internationally collected, award-winning artist who works primarily in pastel, acrylic and oil. He regularly offers workshops and classes and his work is held by public and private companies and individuals in the U.S., France, the United Kingdom, Brazil and Japan. Requirements are listed below.

A People's Choice award will be given out at the November 13, 2024 meeting. A flyer with information on voting will be sent out by the opening of the show for advertisement and how to vote for your favorite piece/s. We encourage you to pass the flyer around to family, friends, etc. to get the word out about the show.

Artwork submitted may be something you painted recently, but can be artwork you've had awhile and hasn't sold. Artwork must fit the theme of this show which is Artist's Choice. Any style, medium, genre, etc. is welcome.





- Only original 2-D and 3-D art, will be considered. Traditional photographs and digitally enhanced photographs are welcome. Drafts, photocopies, offset prints, lithographs, or copies of already published art will not be permitted.
- All artwork can be for sale, but NFS will also be accepted.
- If selected, your artwork will appear in the exhibition from September 28, 2024 to November 30, 2024.
- If your artwork sells, it will be marked on the website as sold and you may proceed with making arrangements to deliver your artwork to the buyer and pay VA sales tax. You will also need to pay a 10% commission fee from your sale payable to SAG. These fees will be used later for awards in our next Juried Virtual show.
- SAG members may submit up to 3 pieces of artwork. Only good quality photos taken without the frame will be accepted. Please make sure you crop your photos well, make sure no shine appears and that the photos are in focus. Any photos that do not meet these criteria will not be accepted.
- If you submit a diptych or triptych, it will count as one piece of artwork.
- Artists selling their art will be responsible for collecting the money, collecting and paying the Virginia sales tax, and all shipping aspects of purchased artwork. SAG's website does not have e-commerce capability. People interested in purchasing art will be directed to a single SAG point of contact who will then contact the individual artists. Commissions will be paid directly to the Springfield Art Guild no later than December 21, 2024. Send your 10% commission check to the SAG Treasurer Sandy Olszowy at 9009 Golden Sunset Lane Springfield, VA 22153. Please put Attn: SAG on the envelope and on the check please make a note that this commission is from your Virtual art show sale.
- Photographs of art must portray a clear and accurate view of what the piece looks like. Artwork previously shown at a SAG sponsored Virtual show may not be submitted.
- You will be submitting your entries on JotForm. Please follow this link:

 The JotForm for the Fall Virtual Show will direct you to enter your contact details and information about each submission, including title, size, medium, and image. Each image must be renamed before you upload it to the JotForm ("YourLastName_FirstName_Title.jpg"). The jpeg needs to be no smaller than 250KB and no larger than 1MB. Many of you may need to resize your photos. Please email sagcurating@gmail.com with any questions about the JotForm submission process.
- Make sure your membership is up to date. This show is open to all currently paid SAG members.
- In submitting to this show, you are agreeing that you are an active SAG member and you are submitting your own artwork.
